

## Frequently Asked Questions:

When should I send home a letter to a child's parent?

A parent should be notified anytime a child is receiving intervention-academic and behavior- that is above and beyond the typical quality instruction and differentiation that a teacher provides. By law, parental permission does not need to be given for a child to receive an intervention, however, proof of notification should be retained.

When does teacher-led intervention become SIT?

The school SIT Team becomes involved when a teacher has reached the conclusion that the child is not making reasonable and adequate progress after 6-9 weeks of consistent, evidence-based interventions, based on a previously set goal. The goal should be based on an appropriate rate of improvement.

What do I do as a teacher when a parent asks me if their child can be evaluated?

The parent should be directed to the SIT team lead. The teacher should inform the parent that Florence One Schools now participates in a Response to Intervention/MTSS model. The teacher should then explain the support their child can receive before evaluation. Evaluation is not granted unless data and trends prove the child could potentially have a disability.
