



2020 - 2021 Expectations for Parents of Virtual Learners

Parental involvement during at-home learning times is critical to student success. Whether your child participates in eLearning as part of our face-to-face instructional model or works online as a member of our Virtual Academy, your help is needed to maximize student growth this year. Please carefully review and adhere to these expectations for parents of remote learners.

1

Provide your student with a working environment that is free from distractions. During Google Meets, students may be easily distracted by barking dogs, loud televisions, noisy siblings, or inappropriately dressed family members who appear in the background.

Make sure that your student works independently on assignments, tests, and quizzes. Just as they would in the physical classroom, students in online classrooms need to work on their own so that teachers can accurately assess their progress.

Help your student monitor time and avoid being late for online sessions. When students are tardy for scheduled Google Meets, they may miss important instructions that are needed to ensure their success on daily assignments.

4

Monitor your student's progress regularly in Google Classroom and PowerSchool. Our online platforms make it easy for parents to monitor grades and view assignment completion. Ask your student's teacher if you need help utilizing these tools.

5

Make sure that your student is prepared for each new day of online learning. Online learners need to be well rested before class each day and should be appropriately dressed just as they would be if they were attending school face to face.

6

Reach out when help is needed. Communication between teachers and parents is vital to success for online learners. Send a message to the teacher if you would like an update on your student's progress or if you have questions or concerns.
